DOURO - ALTITUDE - FRESHNESS

Near the Quinta dos Murças border, steep slopes form a valley. Mostly north-facing, it is sheltered from the sun and, when the wind blows, you can hear it whistle. These are the vineyards whose unique characteristics, including their higher elevations, give rise to the Assobio wines.

Concept: Respecting the tradition of the world's oldest demarcated wine region, these wines are produced only from native varieties. Versatile and gastronomic, they express the cooler side of the Douro.

Harvest Year: It was a year marked by a warmer and drier winter than usual, and a spring with large fluctuations in temperature and precipitation. The beginning of summer was marked by thunderstorms and intense hail that occurred at the end of June and a month of July that was cooler and more humid than usual. In August, temperatures increased, which ended up accelerating maturation. We started harvesting the grapes on August 29th, with balanced grapes.

Viticulture:

Soil Geology: Schist

Age of Vines: about 20 years old

Varieties: Touriga Nacional, Tinta Roriz, Touriga Franca

Vinification: Manual harvest, sorting table, destemming, crushing, prefermentation cold maceration, alcoholic fermentation with controlled temperatures (max. 25°C), pneumatic pressing.

Ageing: 10% of the blend aged in French oak barrels for 6 months.

Bottling: July 2023
